Espionage Activity

For many years, POYNTZ was connected with various Communist activities in New York City, where she was well known as an instructor at the Worker's Communist School, and as a lecturer for the Socialist Party and the International Ladies Garment Workers Union, and where she frequently campaigned for public office under the Communist Party label. A Communist Party official has stated that POYNTZ was a member of the party until 1934, but that she had been inactive since 1928. Until 1935, POYNTZ had been considered as among the first ten Communist leaders in the United States. She travelled abroad frequently, but on three occasions she was denied a -passport because of her Communist activities.

POYNTZ disappeared in New York City approximately June 4, 1937, and at the present time it is unknown whether she is still living or not, although the New York Court declared her legally dead on October 26, 1944.

Several theories have been advanced regarding the disappearance of POYNTZ, some holding that she was



kidnapped by Russian NKVD agents because "she knew too much" and had broken with the party, and others based on the belief that she had been liquidated because of deviation from the party line.

No evidence has been reported from any source which would substantiate these theories, although there was basis for the belief that POYNTZ operated as an agent of Soviet Russia abroad at various times from 1930 to 1937.


Please refer to your letter of July 1, 1953 and subsequent conversations about Beatrice FREEMAN.

I am sorry to say that I have been unable to find any trace of this woman being registered here as an alien or any indication that she became a naturalized British subject at any date. I think it is probable that she became British by virtue of her marriage to a British subject. Acquisition of British nationality by this means was not subject to any form of registration prior to 1949.


We have no trace in our records of Beatrice FREEMAN. I have been able to ascertain that Beatrice Neva Marie Cecile FREEMAN, nee De BEARN, born 17.4.1906 at St. Petersburg, Russia, who would seem to be identical with the subject of your enquiry, obtained a renewal of her British passport in Paris on 4.7.1933. I have been unable to obtain any subsequent information about this woman.

We have a trace of a certain Catherine CURTIS who was described in 1941 as Chairman of the National Legion of the Mothers of America in Washington. have no subsequent information about this woman whose name came to our notice as a result of wartime censorship, in a context which suggested that she was pro-Nazi and anti-British.

Please refer to previous correspondence regarding "Lena," terminating with my letter of August 11, 1952, advising that she has now been identified. This is your reference R.L. 8(2197) B2B/EMcB.

This identification was erroneous. Current suspects are the following two individuals, both of whom sailed from New York on October 7, 1936, aboard the S.S. "Queen Mary":

Beatrice FREEMAN, age thirty, citizen of Britain, born Russia, arrived United States December, 1934, at New York City, advised that she was planning to live in France and had lived for a period of time in New York City.

Catherine CURTIS, age thirty-three, born Russia, citizen of Russia, advised that she was planning to live in the United States and had lived in France before coming to the United States. She said that she had last arrived in the United States on January 23, 1936, at New York City. She further stated that she had lived in New York City, prior to sailing.

I would appreciate receiving any information you can develop concerning these persons, particularly their photographs and descriptions.





A reliable, confidential informant, who has admitted that he was a former member of the Communist Party in the early 1930's, and that he was connected with an espionage ring, advised that his principal was (Juliet Stuart POYNTZ. Y The informant stated that, in about May, 1936, he had met a woman whom he believed to be Juliet POYNTZ's superior. He stated that he believed this individual was head of the "Anti-Nazi" ring in the United States. The informant stated that he only knew this woman as "Lena." He stated that shortly after meeting her, he left the United States for Europe. While he was gone, however, his wife maintained a social relationship with Lena until Lena left the United States in about October, 1936.

The informant's wife recalled that she was first introduced to Lena by her husband in about May, 1936. She found her to be a very intelligent companion and knew that she was engaged in anti-Nazi work. The informant's wife stated that her association with Lena was purely social and that she believed Lena lived in a furnished apartment on 9th Street in Manhattan, between 5th and 6th Avenues, and also for a short time in a small hotel which she believed to be near the corner of 5th Avenue and 8th Street in Manhattan. The informant's wife stated that she also knew the Subject as "Lena." She recalled, however, that Lena had passed as a French-Canadian and could have been using a French-Canadian name. Both the informant and his wife described Lena as an amateur artist.

The informant recalled that his wife had written him in 1936, while he was in Europe, and told him that Lena had been having breakfast with her one morning and that Lena was reading a Russian newspaper and that she saw an article in the paper stating that Lena's husband, who was a Russian General, was killed in Russia.

The informant's wife recalled that Lena had requested her to be a witness on her application for passport; however, on a later date lena told her she had already obtained two witnesses for her passport. She recalls that Lena left the United States for Russia in about October, 1936. In support of this the informant recalled that in late 1936, when



he was in Switzerland, he received a wire from Lena stating she wished to talk to him. He saw her in Zurich, Switzerland, for just a few moments and at that time he told her he was not doing anything further in the Anti-Nazi underground. She bade him farewell and he never saw her after that.

The following description of Lena, as obtained from the informant and his wife, is set out:

The informant's wife recalled that Lena had told her that she had severed this finger in an industrial accident in a factory in Russia. Both the informant and his wife agreed that Lena's true nationality was Russian.

Armand Labis FELDMAN, when interviewed by the RCMP, informed that Lena may be the wife of Vladimir FRIEDMAN, who was associated with FELDMAN in London during 1932.







Extract from copy of a memorandum forwarded by the American Embassy re Gerald Mark MOREN Swiss Soviet Agent - mentioning POYNTZ Julia, American Communist.

Another State Department Memorandum dated July 11, 1939 reported the results of an interview with Krivitsky and Levine by an officer of that agency. This memorandum states that the photograph of Gerard Moren in the Rubens-Robinson Case was examined by Krivitsky. Krivitsky said the name Moran was a name familiar to him in connection with the information from the Brooklyn Navy Yard through Julia POYNTZ who, Krivitsky went on to state, was an agent in New York for the receipt of military and naval intelligence data. Julia Poyntz, it will be noted, mysteriously disappeared sometime in 1938, and it has bee alleged that she was liquidated by the NKVD. The State Department Memorandum does not add anything to the above comment by Krivitsky.

Julia Stuart Glaser was understood to be a contact of Moren and it should be recalled, disappeared under mysterious circumstances. It has been alleged she was a Soviet agent in 1936 and 1937. Information reflected that Julia S. Glaser arrived on the Queen Mary February 22, 1937, and was destined to the Hotel Alamac, New York Sity, She occupied and apartment at 323 West 74th Street, New York City, from March 15, 1935, to September 30, 1936. Although Earl & Calhoun, former agents of the premises, were shown the photograph of Moren, and although they were unable to identify same, they stated it appeared to be a likeness of a man they had seen meeting Miss Glaser from time to time in a lunch room in the vicinity of West 74th treet, but they had never seen him calling at the apartment.

An interview was had with Count and Countess d'Urbania, owners of the premises at 323 West 74th treet, and they identified a photograph of Mrs Poyntz ad being identical with Julia Glaser, their former tenant. They advised that, when Glasengaged the apartment she gave her address then as the Hotel Albert, 65 University Place, New York City, and gave as references Miss Grace Hutchins, 85, Bedford t., New York City, and Dr. N.I. Stone, 150, Riverside Drive, New York City.

....

Graubard advised that Moren was also the principal of Juliet Stuart Poyntz, who was a Ruaaian Agent in 1937, and who recriuted him, Graubard, into the Soviet espionage system.

Juliet Poyntz mysteriously disappeared in 1937 and has never been seen since. According to various articles that have appeared in the Daily newspapers numerous times, it is believed that she was murdered by a Russian agent.



Extract from F.B.I. report on an interview with KRIVITSKY by a State Department representative on June 28, 1939.



...... Krivitsky said that the name Moran was a name familiar to him in connection with information from the Brooklyn Navy Yard through Julia Poyntz, who was an agent in New York for the receipt of military and naval intelligence data. He stated that Julia Poyntz was the mistress of General Putna, and while he did not know the details of her disappearance he thought it very likely that she was removed because of the imminence of the liquidation of General Putna and because of the fear that when this happened she might talk. Levine asked Krivitsky whether he thought there was any truth in the statements made by a writer that she had been taken by Rubens in a motor-boat out to a Russian freighter lying in New York harbor to be returned to Russia. Krivitsky asked why she would be returned to Russia. He thought it unlikely that an unwilling prisoner would be put upon a freight boat with a large crew and slow journey back. He said that if she were to be thrown overboard on the return journey that was a way to do it. He said that if they wanted to learn what she knew it would not be necessary to take her aboard the Russian boat, that she could be taken to a "villa" and, as he expressed it, after she was hurt two or three days she would tell anything they wanted to know. He indicated that they always did talk; if you hurt them continuously for ten days there was usually nothing left to get further information from - in other words, two or three days of torture would bring forth a confession and a torture as long as 10 days would result either in death or insanity.

I suggest that a check-up of Soviet ships which left New York after her disappearance would reveal the vessel on which she was spirited to her fate.





With reference to my letters dated February 11 and April 29, 1938, regarding the Rubens-Robinson case, with particular reference to the photostatic copies of photographs of persons apparently connected with the case, which accompanied the letter of February 11

It is desired that in the event that you have photographs of the persons listed below, they be checked with the other photographs of the photostatic sheet mentioned above to ascertain whether any of the passport imposters are identical with these persons who are described as having been murdered or having disappeared in the past year.

Mr. Rein, who is said to be the son MARC REIN. of the prominent Menshevik leader Rafael Abramovich, is understood to have disappeared in Loyalist Spain in the summer of 1937. It is understood also that he was travelling then on an American passport, but efforts to identify the document used have been fruitless. He is said also to have been a friend of Juliet Stuart Poyntz, an American citizen formerly very prominent in the American Communist Party, who is said by Trotsky leaders in the United States, to have been lured back to the Soviet Union. 'Her present whereabouts is unknown. Gerald Mark Moren is said to have been a friend of Miss Poyntz. He was also a very close friend of Rubens. His photograph has been identified as that upon which a passport was issued to Gerald Mark Moren and he is definitely known to be an imposter. It is possible that he may be identical with Mark Rein.

The following information regarding Juliet Stuart Poyntz is furnished as of possible interest:

It may be recalled that she was one of the most prominent members of the American Communist Party from 1925 to about 1933 and attended the Sixth Congress of the Communist International as a delegate in 1928.

Soviet authorities of the Rubens-Robinson couple has aroused much publicity in the American press and has given rise to many convictions in liberal circles as to the real reasons for the detention of that couple.

Among those who have voiced their opinions is Mr. Carlos Tresca, the well known anarchist, who has stated that the Rubens-Robinson couple are probably Soviet agents called back for disciplinary measures and in this connection he has asserted that Juliet Stuart Poyntz was called back to Moscow in the summer of 1937 and that she has disappeared since then. (Mr. Tresca) states that






